
Jesus meets us where we are.

What is happening with the New Worshiping Community?

Update from Rev. Brooke Scott - Organizing Pastor at Hanover

1. The (NWC) is currently a monthly meal/discussion/activity on a variety of topics related to spirituality, social justice, self-care, healing, and community engagement. All faith backgrounds are invited.

2. We have a small leadership team (LT) that is in regular communication, including Brooke, Kim, Sarah, Kyle, and Ellen. Brooke works to continue meeting others in the community for support, recruitment, and participation.

Most Recent Updates

- 1. We recently finished a monthly book discussion/meal at Books & Bagels on "Rest is Resistance" by Tricia Hersey. Open to Wilmington community. Well-attended—17 total.
- 2. Hanover reimburses for any materials, mainly meals.
- 3. We are working to hire a consulting agency (Rise Collective) to assist with branding/communication (through this process, we are hoping to see a name/mission statement begin to emerge). This will require funding. \$250 initially, more depending on what else we may need.

Brooke has worked with Network Delaware in regards to coaching leadership development/brainstorming. They have also offered to partner with the emerging group.

Updated Goals

- 1. To schedule consultation to come up with name, mission, logo, website, social media.
- 2. To create budget for meals, consultation materials, speakers, Slack (for communication).
- 3. To continue adding to our number of participants.
- 4. Applying for PCUSA Seed Grant.
- 5. Creating a regular schedule for programming/events

To begin partnering with Network Delaware & other like-minded individuals and organizations such as interfaith, nonprofits, etc.

Support Needed from Hanover

- 1. Information about how to access funds (budget limits, credit card, etc.)
- 2. Continued willingness to share information about events
- 3. Continued plan for Brooke to join in worship and stay in communication with Hanover Session and members.

Other Accountability and Support

- 1. Brooke remains in continual contact with NWC Leadership Team (LT), continuing to meet in person and/or virtually at least once monthly.
- 2. Brooke regularly participates in groups like Interfaith 9th Ward, Clergy for Choice (Planned Parenthood), and Network Delaware events in order to network, understand issues surrounding the community, and recruit.
- 3. Brooke is currently receiving community organizing training through Network Delaware.
- 4. Brooke remains in regular consultation with Tracy Keenan.
- 5. Brooke is now receiving official New Worshiping Community (NWC) Coaching through PCUSA to assist in her efforts to see a lasting group emerge.
- 6. Brooke is hopeful about joining a NWC cohort with other ministry leaders in similar startup projects.
